

ABOUT MARTIN ROSCOE

With an extraordinary career spanning over four decades, **Martin Roscoe** is renowned for his versatility at the keyboard and is equally at home in concerto, recital and chamber performances. With a repertoire of over 100 concertos, Martin works regularly with many of the UK's leading orchestras and has partnered eminent conductors such as Sir Simon Rattle, Sir Mark Elder and Christoph von Dohnányi.

Having made over 500 broadcasts, including seven BBC Prom appearances, Martin is one of the most regularly played pianists on BBC Radio 3. He is currently Professor of Piano at the Guildhall School of Music in London, where he has recently been awarded a Fellowship.
